This program was developed with Waste Diversion Ontario, on behalf of the Ontario government, under the Waste Diversion Act. The program helps protect human health, our water ways and ecosystems while creating a cleaner environmental future for Ontarians.

The OES program is regulated and meets rigorous standards. OES service providers must adhere to strict regulations and use a variety of techniques to ensure sensitive data is destroyed in the recycling process.

You *could* hold on to your old, obsolete electronics – but why? Instead, give new life to your dated devices by bringing them to one of hundreds of drop-off sites across Ontario. The list of sites includes retailers, municipal depots, certified processors and trusted collectors.

From there, end-of-life electronics are safely sorted for secure recycling or reuse and refurbishment. Some contain substances of concern, so they should never go to landfill.

What does the drop-off service cost?

Zilch. Nada. Nothing. We are funded by fees paid to OES by the electronics producers themselves. This is a free service that encourages waste diversion. The Environmental Handling Fee (EHF) you likely paid on purchasing new electronics covers collection, transportation and processing of electronic waste, as well as research and educational programs to promote responsible management of end-of-life electronics.

Where can you take items?

Check [RECYCLEYOURELECTRONICS.ca](https://www.recycleyourelectronics.ca) for a list of acceptable items that qualify for this service. You can easily search by material or look up the permanent or event-based drop-off site nearest you. And no worries – 85% of Ontarians live within 10 kilometres of a drop-off facility.

Did you know?

- You can raise money for your cause by holding an electronics collection event.
- Electronics contain ingredients like precious metals, including gold, silver and platinum, and base metals like steel, iron, zinc and copper.
- 14 tonnes of e-waste creates 1 tonne of copper, without underground mining.
- Recovered plastics are recycled into plastic components for new electronic devices or other products like auto parts and garden furniture.
